Dear Parent

Children Working From Home

The number of staff who have tested positive or who are self-isolating has continued to increase over this week. We have reached a point where we will need to reduce the numbers of pupils in school even further. The vast majority of Year 11 pupils are already self-isolating and will not return until after the Christmas holidays. Therefore, from Friday 11th 2020 until Friday 18th December 2020 (end of term), Year 11 pupils will be educated at home.

This measure will increase our capacity to provide high quality lessons for pupils at home. For Year 11, all home learning will be provided by either live lessons on Microsoft Teams or recorded video lessons on Show My Homework and pupils will follow their normal timetable.

Please find below important information regarding Year 11 and their home learning.

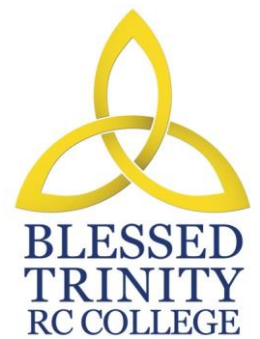
- Whilst at home pupils will be expected to follow their normal lesson timetable.
- Pupils will be expected to log in live with their Form Tutor by 8.45am. They will receive their attendance mark and will follow their Pastoral and PSHE timetable. If your child is ill, normal protocol will be followed. Please can we ask you to inform school if your child is unwell and will not be attending lessons. Contact will be made from school if your son/daughter does not attend their online registration.
- Most lessons will be taught live via Microsoft Teams and the details of how to access lessons can be found at <https://www.loom.com/share/724c8b75474b4e2e8d6ab9f99f142243> Where teachers are self-isolating, lessons will be a recording from their teacher and will be available on Show My Homework.
- To support your child with their learning and organisation, pupils will be encouraged to complete their work in an A4 pad/paper. This way all work can be dated and kept safely. If your son/daughter would prefer to do their work electronically and print it then this would also be suitable. Pupils will be asked to bring their work in when they return to school. This will then be secured in their classroom books.
- All pupils are expected to attend all lessons and complete all the work that is being asked of them by their teachers.
- Lessons will be 50 minutes long.
